APPLICATIONS AND INFORMATION

Interns must be of Māori descent, have a tertiary qualification and/or minimum of three years continuous experience working in the arts as an artist, producer or administrator. The internships are paid and will run for a maximum of 20 weeks based on 36 working hours per week. The interns will be contracted with Toi Māori Aotearoa on a fixed term employment contract, which will be subject to tax. Interns are expected to set aside time to liaise with an assigned mentor.

Toi Māori Aotearoa will seek placements for interns with arts organisations dependent on each intern’s skills, interests and preference. The actual hours and period of work will be confirmed in conjunction with the host organisation.
